

I think the held hostage for 21 days is described in the last long email I sent you. Yes it's accurate. The following acts satisfy the key elements of kidnapping. And they constitute very serious crime by JR Olson.

JR Olson did the following 3 things:

1. Disabled our car by stealing the battery out of it as we were driving to Canada, in the dead of winter, in the wilderness

(people not from Alaska don't understand the seriousness of this. There aren't gas stations and towns along the road. It's just empty bush for days in all directions. A friend of mine was out on his trap line and came back to find a guy stealing gas out of his truck. He shot and killed the guy, and was not charged with a crime because he said he was defending his life. If he had no gas and was out on the Steese highway, he would freeze and die. It's also against the law in Alaska to pass a hitch-hiker in the winter and not stop to pick them up or check on them. And if they die, you can be charged with negligent manslaughter. Travel in Alaska is not like travel in the lower 48.)

2. Relayed death threats from Bill Fulton to put us in fear of our lives

3. Made up the trucker story and one delay after another after another to keep us hiding out in the attic

My real good state attorney Robert John is the one who briefed this issue the best. Can you find his pre-trial motion on pacer? He filed it in my case. And he also wrote a supplemental brief for the appeal court that they wouldn't let him file. That is good too.

I believe the Rule 60 (b) motion covers this well. But basically, we left the country for fear of Fulton after his death threat was relayed to us by Olson on Feb 6th. Then Olson chased us down and stole the battery out of our car, then told us we couldn't go get it fixed ourselves because Fulton was searching for me to kill me, and that he could hide us out in Coleman's attic for a day and a half until his friend the "trucker" showed up to haul us out. he then made up one excuse after another about why the trucker was delayed.

JR Olson's handler, FBI Agent Rick Southerland testified that he had Olson do this. The FBI knows that this is kidnapping, they are the ones that investigate and prosecute kidnappings. To commit crimes in the course of an investigation, such as Fulton's assault with the hunting knife, and Olson's kidnapping of a family with small children, they have to have authorization from the FBI director himself. So that means that FBI director James Comey was getting daily briefs on this and approving the commission of crimes by Fulton and Olson. I suspect the kid-diddler's club goes clear to the top. This was all political corruption. Olson and Fulton were just foot soldiers for the gangster state. Skrocki is a lieutenant. Comey is a made man.
