I'm proud of how brave you are. You also have a fun sense of humor and a charming way about you. My heart glows with joy to know you are my daughter. The blood your heart is pumping is MY blood. I gave it to you. So anytime you feel lonely just feel your pulse and know that I am with you because I am in your blood.

Bri, when I'm out at sea on my sailboat at night and I look up into the clear sky at billions of stars shining so bright that it looks like I could reach out and touch them, I feel awestruck and captivated. That's how I felt when I saw you.

I hope you have all of my good qualities and none of my bad ones.

What did you end up using with your \$50 on? I'm sure you will spend it smart. I bet you'd be a hit with unboxing videos. How much would a used camera in good condition be?

Find out and let me know. If that is something you want to do I'll help you make it happen.

Someday when I get out of prison I'll be able to watch all your videos.

I'm in solitary confinement right now, but as soon as I get out I'll call you. I want to hear your voice. Are you old enough to have your own email address? I can start sending you emails as soon as you are able to read them and reply on your own.

You did so good at our visit. It was super long, but you were very mature and had no problems at all. I'm sorry you got locked in the bathroom. Did you freak out or cry? You seemed fine when you came out.

When I get out, you can pick any adventure in the world and we'll go on it. It will be the most fun you've ever had, I promise. We could raft the Amazon River, climb Mt. Everest, sail around the world, run with the bulls in Spain, bike across the country, go cliff diving in Mexico, or go skydiving out of our own plane. Just say the word, and off we'll go!

You are still my best friend and I can't wait to see you again, hopefully, not in prison. I love you,
