INTERVIEW WITH MICHAEL N. MARUSCHAK III

- 1. On Tuesday, September 11, 2012, I interviewed Agent Michael N. Maruschak regarding the officer involved shooting that occurred at the Parkway Store located at 1535 Highway K, St. Clair, Missouri. Agent Maruschak was assigned rear security in an arrest attempt on Jeffrey R. Weinhaus who had felony warrants for his arrest.
- 2. Maruschak is described as Michael N Maruschak, white male, date of birth , address 1400 Independence Drive, Suite 1402, Rolla, Missouri, telephone number . Maruschak is employed as a special agent for the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI).
- Agent Maruschak provided me the following information. Agent Maruschak said he was contacted by Sergeant H. Jamie Folsom of the Missouri State Highway Patrol Division of Drug and Crime Control, Troop I Rolla, requesting assistance with an arrest attempt on Jeffrey R. Weinhaus. According to Agent Maruschak, he advised that he and his partner, Agent Patrick Cunningham, were supposed to provide rear security.
- 4. Agent Maruschak said they arrived at the MFA store on Highway K around 1300 hours. He said he positioned his vehicle on the southeast portion of the parking lot while Corporal Scott E. Mertens of the Missouri State Highway Patrol, Division of Drug and Crime Control, Troop I, Rolla, positioned his vehicle on the northwest portion of the parking lot next to Highway K by the north entrance.
- 5. Agent Maruschak told me he observed Jeffrey Weinhaus' vehicle, a green Subaru Forrester, pull into the north entrance of the parking lot and park next to Corporal Mertens' patrol vehicle, facing south. He saw Weinhaus exit his vehicle and approach Sergeant Folsom. He further advised he did not observe any other occupants inside Weinhaus' vehicle. Agent Maruschak said he observed Weinhaus reach to the front of his waistband and at the same time he observed Sergeant Folsom raise his right hand and took a side step. At that point he observed Sergeant Folsom firing his duty weapon and observed Weinhaus falling to the ground. He further advised he and his partner ran to assist Sergeant Folsom and they provided security at the scene pending arrival * of additional back up and Emergency Medical Assistance. **DEFENDANT'S**
