In response to the devastating impact of the deadliest earthquake in Sichuan Province of China since 1976 that claimed over 80,000 human lives, FWCFFA launched two rounds of donation campaigns. Many of our association members and friends extended a helping hand to the disaster relief efforts and the people affected by the disaster; the total amount of individual donations our association received in a short period exceeds \$2,500. Including FWCFFA's \$300, all the funds were sent, through the Chinese Consulate in Chicago, to the Sichuan earthquake victims. We know that our donations constitute part of the overall relief
