Recognition of Sexual Abuse

The following are signs that an assault may have occurred:

- Has difficult or pain while walking
- Has difficulty or pain while sitting
- Has unusual bruises or marks indicative of an assault
- Bloody clothing/undergarments
- Bloody linen
- Frequent requests for health care
- Frequent requests for laundry
- Decrease in interest in normal activities
- Withdrawal from social activities
- Abrupt attitude changes

Prevention

Staff aid in the prevention of sexual assaults/abuse by frequent observation of their areas and the behavior of persons assigned to these areas. They should note any offenders/staff loitering in spots not observable by staff persons or cameras.
