These practices have been shown to help EL students attain the Common Core Standards and achieve academically.

Bilingual Educators' Institute: PRACTICES THAT WORK FOR ELS



NMABE will feature effective practices that the Bilingual Multicultural Education Bureau has identified in districts and schools which have produced high academic outcomes for their English Learner populations. Unique practices found to be effective in each region of the state will be shared with teachers and administrators at the NMABE annual Bilingual Educators' Institute, held in conjunction with Bilingual Education Day at the Legislature. The Institute will also offer a major session on Literacy Squared® (http://literacysquared.org/?page id=15) emphasizing practices that can accelerate the development

of biliteracy. While designed for Spanish- and English-speaking children, the model posits that literacy needs to be taught from the linguistic framework of each individual's language. As such, the framework's concepts should be useful for Native American Bilingual Education practitioners as well. Finally, the Institute will also focus on the new *EL Crosswalk*, designed to augment the NM TEACH evaluation tool, for use by any teacher working with English learners. The registration fee is \$150.00.

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Pre-Conference Institute on Tribal Language Development Among Young Children: Current Issues for New Mexico Tribes and Nations.

Hosted by the American Indian Language Policy Research and Teacher Training Center at the University of New Mexico, Wednesday, November 19, 2014 8:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.

American Indian language and culture serve as the foundations for preparing American Indian children to take their place as members and future leaders in their respective communities. This primary goal of continued cultural survival has prompted many New Mexico tribes to initiate community-based Native language maintenance and regeneration efforts. Some of these efforts have been specifically focused on starting early with young children, either through language programs in day care centers, immersion programs in standard Head Start, Language Immersion "Nests", and most recently, a new Keres Montessori School.

This one-day Institute will convene prior to the opening of the La Cosecha 2013 Dual Language Conference and will feature several sessions in which current language issues will be presented and discussed, including:

- Recent efforts at the state level to create a language assessment protocol for tribes to use in assessing children's Native language development; and
- The implications of the new NM State Bilingual Seal for tribes that have secondary-level Native language programs and other issues affecting early childhood programs in New Mexico.

School administrators, parents, tribal education board members, tribal education directors, Native language teachers and elders are especially encouraged to attend this institute to learn more about key issues that affect the potential outcome of tribal language efforts in New Mexico. There is no charge for this one-day event; however, seating is limited.
