Lisa Murphy lives it and sings it Sincing Cowsiri

entertains all audiences

Whether it's country, easy listening, or 50's that audiences want, Lisa Murphy can tailor her music to fit. Of it all, "The Singing Cowgirl" has a favorite...the music of John Denver.

Music has been a lifelong thing for Murphy, going back to when she was 11 years old.

She explained, "My idol was John Denver. I told myself, 'If John Denver can play a guitar, so can !!' After many hours of intense prac-

ticing (even though my fingers were killing me), I finally learned to master the guitar. I think singing along to all those John Denver albums made my vocal cords pretty strong, too. I do have an "ear for music," and discovered I could play songs just by listening to them, picking out the keys in my head."

John Denver was not only Murphy's idol, but also a family friend and someone who inspired her to keep going through sore fingers and all.

Although she's been performing for more than three decades, it's only the last six or seven years that Lisa took her music to the "second level," working to make it full time. As she does that, she's fortunate to have an understanding employer who'll allow her to work around her music schedule. She's a part-time custodian at TBEI (formerly Crysteel) and also does some dental assisting work, the career she was trained for.

A flexible schedule is necessary as Murphy performed 176 shows last year—from Sioux Falls to the Winona area. Although she hasn't done a lot of jobs in the metro area yet, she's had some in the south metro area, and is looking to pursue more there.

"I call myself a variety singer. I cater to every age group," Murphy said. "I give very family-oriented shows."

Murphy performs at assisted living and senior centers, county fairs, private parties, weddings...pretty much any venue. Shows at the senior centers are usually 45 minutes. At county fairs, she usually does two one-hour shows.

"Private parties are one of my favorites. I do an interactive show. I get people involved. It's so much fun and so personal," Lisa said. "Anybody can step up the microphone. How you entertain people determines

whether you'll be successful or not."

Murphy also does an annual John Denver tribute concert every year.

Since a friend moved to Georgia a number of years ago, Lisa goes there every year and does shows at senior living communities. At one show this year, she brought a 95-year-old woman on stage and had her dancing to "Rock Around the Clock."

"I enjoy getting people involved," she said. "I can play for a few people or thousands-I've been doing this way too many years to be freaking out."

Before being considered a professional, Murphy took part in the Minnesota State Fair Amateur Talent Contest and sang in front of an audience of 6,000. That only inspired her, not intimidated her.
