It has been brought to my attention by the Group, that a proposed open pit mining Project has been submitted to, and approved by, our Council (ref# A2501-CPTAQ request dated 06-12-2016 and Council Resolution #2016-12-319 dated 13-12-2016).

We have been informed that the resolution of the municipal council sent to the CPTAQ was possibly rejected due to the fact that it wasn't in compliance with the Law. So, this gives you the perfect opportunity to annul the resolution and to send a new unanimous resolution against the proposed Project.

We wish to advise you that this Group of concerned citizens will vigorously object to any and all Projects that do not conform to our Municipal, Provincial and /or Federal Laws and that do not take into consideration the effects this project will have on the citizens of the Municipality.

Following are just three of the many reasons why you should be against this project:

- 2) It appears to us that our Bylaws do not permit it;
- 3) You did not notify, advise or consult with the citizens.
