



Cause for Concern:

The nursery has a key role in ensuring priority is given at all times to safeguarding children in our care. The Cause for Concern Policy and Procedure states what action will be taken by nursery employees to ensure all concerns are addressed and action taken immediately.

The Cause for Concern Form must be completed if a concern is raised regarding a child, (no matter how minor the concern may be). This form must be completed immediately and the concern raised with the Designated Safeguarding Lead whilst the child is still on site. If support is required regarding completion of the Cause for Concern Form, this can be obtained from the Designated Safeguarding Lead. The Designated Safeguarding Lead will then act upon the concern appropriately, giving feedback to the member of staff. If the staff member is not happy with the feedback received, they are advised to contact the Local Safeguarding Board themselves if this was not already the action taken by the Designated Safeguarding Lead.
