The Rushen Heritage Trust represents a new way for people to discover the South of the Island as well as bringing the community together. Leaving behind the 'bricks and mortar' approach to museums, our vision is for an online museum, supplemented by 'pop up' exhibitions driven by local volunteers. We want our content to be accessible worldwide, in a way that encourages people to visit the Beautiful South of Rushen Sheading. Our curators are our volunteers, who have chosen fascinating topics across a wide spectrum of our history, bringing it up to date with interactive walking tours.

The next three years are set to be very exciting for Rushen Heritage Trust and we hope that our three year plan will inspire you to get involved in our vision!

In the beginning...

Over the course of many consultations and workshops with vital partners such as the trading associations of Port Erin and Port St Mary, the Rushen Rotary Club, Manx National Heritage and Culture Vannin plus the expertise and advice of specialists such as JW Qualtrough, JK Qualtrough, Nigel Crowe, Mike Kewley and Edmund Southworth (not to mention the support of 120 people at our first public meeting on a very wet and windy night in April 2014...) **Rushen Heritage Trust was officially launched on 25th July 2014 and we became the "Museum of No Fixed Abode"**

Why "No Fixed Abode?"

Because we do not want one. A building costs money to buy and needs volunteers to staff. People visit it once and say "I've done that". So we run exhibitions and "Pop-Up" events in a variety of places around Rushen, save costs and encourage people to visit Rushen many times. And... **the future is online.**

Over 4,000 visitors in 2015

RHT is non-profit organisation led by our Heritage Action Teams (HATs) -The **Story of the Land**, The **Story of the Sea**, **Tourism** and **WW2 Women's Internment**. Responsible for their own exhibitions, publications and dissemination of content, the HATs choose their own topics, driven by community interest and focusing on people and their stories.

In 2015 we saw over 4,000 visitors to our two major exhibitions "**Friend or Foe**" from the Internment HAT and "**The Glory Days of Southern Tourism**" created by the Tourism HAT. Both were extremely successful and will be continued in 2016 by two more exhibitions and short publications.



In 2016 our Story of the Land HAT will host their first exhibition based on the book "A Year on Ballachurry Farm 1943-44" written by Stanley Clucas, which will be available to buy next summer. The Story of the Sea HAT will close the summer events with a series of talks and lectures - and don't forget to look out for us at the Southern and Royal Agricultural fairs!

New Coordinator for the Trust

Laura Cuthbertson joined RHT on 17th August in a part time role to provide cultural services. Director Hugh Davidson commented "We had a number of very strong candidates, but Laura met the specification with a degree in Journalism and skills in social media and marketing. She has a positive and enthusiastic approach with much experience of working with schools and organising UK national conferences."

Laura Cuthbertson will coordinate the activities of the four Heritage Action Teams as well as develop our online content worldwide.

Her role will be to coordinate the HATs and our supporting specialists in IT, film and interviewing; to involve the whole Rushen community in some aspect of heritage; to help communicate widely the excellent content developed by HATs, especially online and via social media; and to help implement our three year plan."

The World's Largest Black Forest Gateau

May 29th 2015 marked the 75th anniversary of the arrival of more than 3,000 women internees in Port Erin. To celebrate, Bradda Glen Restaurant and Tea Rooms created a two-metre Black Forest gateau replete with a defensive fortification of Manx bonnag for a tea party event on that day.

Unveiling plans for interactive walking trails in Rushen

We have developed a unique mobile application "**iomWalks**" which will bring to life the outdoor walking trails of the Isle of Man, preserving the rich heritage of the communities on the island and sharing the memories of people, places and past events with local residents and visitors.

Working in partnership with Fuzzelogic Solutions in Douglas, the project will be initiated by the development of a pilot trail of 15 stations from Port St Mary to the Sound, launching Spring 2016. An **interactive beacon** will be attached to each station and will broadcast signals, activating an app on your mobile phone full of text, images, film and audio all about the heritage of the environment you are walking through.



Our vision is to become internationally recognised as an interactive walk, supported by local organisations to share cultural and heritage information with residents and tourists, generating significant economic benefit for the Isle of Man. By 2018 we hope to have a fully completed and interactive "Rushen Walk" from Port St Mary to Fleshwick.


Our second instalment of this fantastic exhibition, looking at the lives and stories of Rushen Camp W and the creation of the world's only Married Camp in World War Two.
