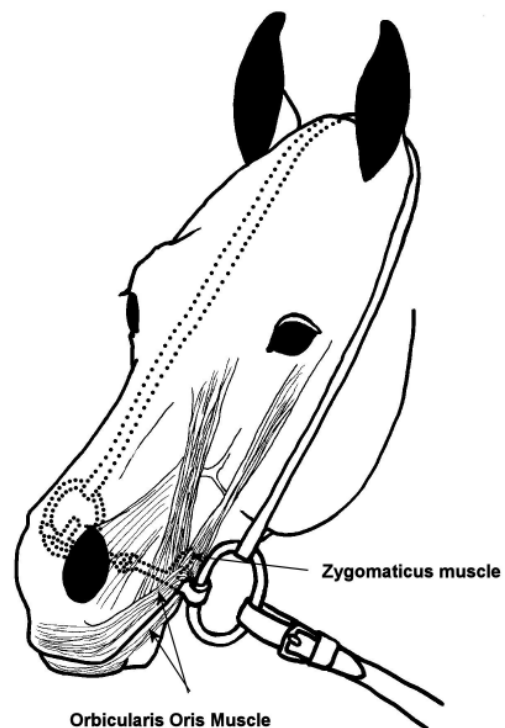


Fitting your Compass Bit

- The most ideal headstall for your Compass bit has:
 - a brow band
 - has an adjustable buckle on both sides
 - holes for adjustment that are 1/2 inch apart from each other.

Putting the headstall on the horse

- Holding the top of the headstall with your right hand between the horse's ears, cradle the bit in your left hand using your thumb and pointer finger.
- Place the middle finger of the left hand between the horse's lips in the corner of the horse's mouth. When the horse opens its mouth, slip the snaffle up inside the horse's mouth. While doing so, slip the horse's left ear thru the headstall and finish by placing the right ear through the headstall.
- The protrusions of the compass bit fit just inside the corner of the horse's mouth next to the horse's cheek muscle.
- Adjust the headstall evenly on both sides until the mouthpiece is touching evenly in the left and right corners of the horse's mouth.
- Proper adjustment of the Compass bit is critical for achieving the best results
- Proper adjustment of the Compass Snaffle in this location is critical for best results.
