Here's what you need to Do

- Clear your countertops prior to the install
- Move appliances, that were not previously arranged for us to do
- Move gas appliances, perform
 electrical work or plumbing within walls
- Clear any drain blockages, or sediment build-up on filters, aerators and faucet nozzles
- Provide a work area close to the installation area
- Perform paint, wall, tile or other touchups after the installation
- Purchase your sink, brackets and other add-ons

Prepare for the Install

• Clear all items off the counters



• Remove drawers, and clear out corner & sink cabinets



• Move appliances out of the way



 Provide clear access and a sheltered working area



 Be available for review and final signoff on your new countertops



General Option Considerations

- **Patterns**: If you have chosen a finish with strong textures or grains, please be aware that they will not align at corners.
- **Finishes**: please be aware that finishes including Gloss, Polished and Micro Dot are more susceptible to showing fine scratches and scuffing.
- Dark and Solid Finishes: please be aware that these finishes highlight streaks from cleaning, and factory finish irregularities, and can be difficult to clean.
- Sinks without Rear Clamps: some sinks only rely on the faucet to hold down the back rim. Please be aware that the seal on this type of sink at the back can degrade with use over time and are not recommended.
- Walls: please be aware that to ensure a seamless fit of your new countertop, the removal and installation process may cause minor damage to adjacent walls that will require you to touch-up after the installation.
- Flooring: if we are asked to help move an appliance to facilitate the installation, please be aware that we are not responsible for any damage to the floor that may occur.

The above are general considerations, and are **not** covered under your new countertop's limited warranty policy.

Applicable Waivers

- New Plumbing: if we are installing new plumbing fixtures, please be aware we are not responsible to repair or replace faulty units, but can work with you to repair these at an additional charge
- Existing Plumbing: we will do our best to reinstall your existing fixtures, but often aged plumbing no longer seals after reinstallation and can leak. Please be aware that we can try to repair or replace these, but it will incur additional charges.
- □ **Tiles & Mirrors**: we will try to remove and/or install your countertops under existing tiles or mirrors, but please be aware that if damage occurs to them, we are not responsible to fix or replace them.
- Seam Location: the industry standard for a countertop seam, is that it should be more than 12" from any sink. For your configuration, please be aware that the warranty will not cover water related damage at the seam due to its proximity to the sink.
- Cabinets: due to the way your cabinets were built, or their age and current configuration, please be aware that we cannot guarantee that removal of the countertop will not damage your cabinets or frames.
- The applicable waivers checked above are **not** covered by your new countertop's limited warranty policy.

Using your new Countertop

Don't use your countertop as a cutting • board





Don't slide abrasive items across the counter or use 'magic' erasers





Don't place hot items directly on the surface, use a trivet



Don't operate humid appliances near seams



Refer to more details in your warranty for ongoing care and use of your new countertop.

Caring for your new Countertop

- Clean up water spills, especially near seams and sinks, with a clean dry cloth
- General cleaning can be done with a cloth dampened with a mild cleaning detergent



• For more difficult stains, use a light cleaning solution or alcohol, and clean with a damp cloth after removing the stain



 Don't use abrasive cleaners with acids or bleaches, and don't use scouring pads or 'magic' erasers
