QUESTIONS FOR "CONTEXTUALIZING" SUBJECT MATTER

Perhaps the best way to "contextualize" subject matter within the "larger frame of reference" provided by a Biblical Worldview, is to pose open-ended questions that prompt reflection on how that subject matter relates to the biblical view of God, Creation, Humanity, Moral Order and Purpose. As we think deeply about answers, as guided by God's Word, we can personalize our understanding of things. And with this personalization may come a higher sense of meaning and purpose.

Below are examples of open-ended questions that prompt "contextualization" with the largest frame of reference possible. Wording of some questions may need to be adjusted for the very young.

"GOD" QUESTIONS:
