

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED TO PURCHASE A FIREARM IN CALIFORNIA

- ALL FIREARMS
 - IF YOU ARE A PERMANENT RESIDENT (I.E. GREEN CARD HOLDER), THEN YOU MUST BRING YOUR GREEN CARD SO IT MAY BE RECORDED ON STATE AND FEDERAL DOCUMENTS.

- HANDGUN
 - VALID CALIFORNIA DRIVER'S LICENSE OR ID
 - If the address on the license is NOT your residence address, you must satisfy federal law by also providing a government-issued (local, state, or federal) document (i.e. valid vehicle registration) that shows your name and current residence address. See companion document attached.
 - PROOF OF CALIFORNIA RESIDENCE
 - If the address on your license is current, then you must bring one of the documents listed in the companion document attached.
 - FIREARMS SAFETY CERTIFICATE
 - If you don't have one, we can test you and issue the certificate on the spot. See companion document attached.

- LONG GUN
 - CALIFORNIA DRIVER'S LICENSE
 - If the address on the license is NOT your residence address, you must satisfy federal law by also providing a government-issued (local, state, or federal) document (i.e. valid vehicle registration) that shows your name and current residence address. See companion document attached.
 - FIREARMS SAFETY CERTIFICATE
 - If you don't have one, we can test you and issue the certificate on the spot. See companion document attached.

- GUN SAFE/LOCK INFORMATION
 - If you are purchasing a long gun and the manufacturer (or other seller) has included a CA DOJ approved gun lock, both CA and federal law are satisfied and no further action is required on your part. If a CA DOJ approved lock is NOT included with the long gun as described above, you must 1) provide the make and model of a gun safe (gun safe requirements described companion document attached) you already own, 2) bring a CA DOJ approved lock you already own (gun lock requirements described in companion document attached) or, 3) per federal law, purchase a gun lock at the time of sale.
 - If you are purchasing a handgun and the manufacturer (or other seller) has included a CA DOJ approved gun lock, both CA and federal law are satisfied and no further action is required on your part. If a CA DOJ approved lock is NOT included with the gun as described above, you must 1) bring a CA DOJ approved lock you already own (gun lock requirements described in companion document attached) or, 2) per federal law, purchase a gun lock at the time of sale.
