


Ladies, you are in for a real treat.



Please tell all your neighbors and friends. We also need your donations - so it is Spring Cleaning time for those closets and cupboards. Many hands make for light work.



figurines depicting the women of the past 100 years.

✤ The first figurine depicting 1890 – 1914 was offered for sale during the administration of Juanita Martin Bryant, 1982 – 1984. At the end of her term the mold was broken.

 ✤ The second figurine represents circa 1915 – 1939 and was offered during the administration of Jeri J.
Winger, 1984 – 1986. Again the mold was broken.

✤ The third figurine represents circa 1940 – 1964 and was offered during the administration of Phyllis Vreeland Roberts, 1986 – 1988. Again the mold was broken.

✤ The fourth and final figurine depicting 1965 – 1990 was offered during the administration of Alice Clark Donahue, 1988 – 1990. The final mold was broken so that no more could be produced.

Today two sets reside in National Headquarters, one in the office of the president and the other in the 1728 third floor hallway cabinet.

Through the generosity of one of our members we are offering a full set of the beautiful figurines as a raffle prize.

The raffle will be closed at our April 16, 2016 GFWC Nevada State Convention.

Tickets are \$10 each. It is not necessary to be present to win. Included with the figurines are two pages of the 125th Anniversary Postage Stamps issued by GFWC and the commemorative pin made available at the 125th Convention in Memphis, Tennessee. This is a value of approximately \$745.

After testing they began a Heparin infusion that continued until I came home Wednesday, February 17. I am on oxygen 24/7 and Elíquís twíce a day. I have a doctor's appointment Tuesday February 23, at 11:15, to talk about further treatment. She has mentioned Physical Therapy to learn my limitations so the groin clots don't break free also a Blood Specialist to be sure we are doing all we can to avoid more clots. We will do periodic sonograms of the legs to check on the status of the clots. The body has to absorb the clots. They cannot be broken up. Thank you for your healing thoughts. Joan Powell
