MAY IS BETTER HEARING AND SPEECH MONTH!

"LISTEN UP! TURN IT DOWN!" TAMARAC ELEMENTARY SCHOOL 4th GRADERS

Upon arrival at Tamarac Elementary School for a 10:00 a.m. LUTD presentation on Wednesday, May 17th, Carol and Ken Zeber were surprised to find the students outside. Met by Principal Roberta Ray in the parking lot, they were advised that there had been a possible gas leak and the school had been evacuated. Police and fire rescue arrived and, in about 25 minutes, determined that the school was safe.

Fourth graders were instructed to report directly to the cafeteria for the presentation and it was quite a scene, since we still had to set up, which was difficult since the school has all new equipment and our contact at the school was unfamiliar with it. Not to mention, the fact that students were still very excited over the unplanned event of the morning.



Finally, it became so loud that Carol took the opportunity to turn on her decibel counter, asked for the microphone and skipped the beginning discussion about the ear and hearing hair cells. She went straight to decibels, announcing that they (the kids) had reached the danger level in their own cafeteria – 85 decibels. It worked. They were instantly interested, especially when told they could find free decibel counters on their cell phones and use them to determine the safety of their hearing.

By the time that portion of the program was over, the Power Point was working and Carol could backtrack to the explanation of how we hear and the importance of those hearing hair cells. One hundred and forty young people were in attendance. As usual, the youngsters loved the "Turn it to the Left" song.

A big thanks to Ken Zeber for getting the heavy packages, pencils, and earplugs into the car, then into the school. Thanks also to the teachers, who helped Ken hand out the packages and to Maida Kopet for making it all work.

A big thank you, also, to Nancy Seddon for helping to put the packages together for the students.
