### **Class B Southwest Representative Candidate Kelly Koppinger, Superintendent, New England**

Kelly Koppinger is a 1977 graduate of New England High School. Kelly graduated from Dickinson State University in 1988 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Chemistry and Math Education. He earned his Master's in Education Administration from the University of North Dakota in 2002.

In 1989, Kelly began his teaching and coaching career in Richardton-Taylor as a science and math education teacher while serving as the head boys basketball and head girls basketball coach.

Kelly became the math and science education teacher, assistant girls basketball coach, and head boys basketball coach at Belfield High School in 1995.

In order to pursue his Master's degree in education, Kelly took a position at Dickinson State University in 1998 where he worked in the Student Support Services and taught math. He was actively involved in the Staff Senate and TRIO program.

Upon receiving his Master's degree from the University of North Dakota, Kelly accepted the high school principal and Activities Director positions at Belfield High School in 2002. He also taught math and coached junior high football.

Kelly accepted the high school principal position for Dickinson Catholic Schools in 2004 serving in that capacity for one year before becoming superintendent/high school principal of Dickinson Catholic Schools. During that time, he helped manage district, regional, and invitational tournaments in southwestern North Dakota.

In 2008, Kelly became the Superintendent of Stanley Community Schools serving in that capacity for three years until assuming a banking position back home in southwestern North Dakota. He worked at American Bank Center for two years until he assumed the New England superintendent position in 2014. He has been the New England superintendent for the past three years. While in Stanley, he also helped manage district, regional, and invitational tournaments in northwestern North Dakota.

Kelly is currently a member of NDCEL and NDASA. He is an active member of both the communities of New England and Dickinson serving on several boards and committees in both communities.

Kelly's wife of over thirty years, Judy, is a nurse at Saint Joseph's/CHI hospital. They have three adult children. Nicole lives in Alaska with her husband Phillip Leck and their set of twins. Robyn lives in Dickinson with her husband Rafe Espinoza and their two children. Kohl recently graduated from the University of North Dakota with a degree in Petroleum Engineering.

When Kelly's daughter was born thirty years ago, he knew she was the inspiration he had been waiting for. She gave him a renewed vitality and strength to pursue his passion for education. Reflecting on the fact that his formal education provided him with many opportunities and possibilities, Kelly was determined to provide his daughter the same opportunities so he went back to school to become a teacher and a coach. **Class B Southwest Representative Candidate**  
**Tyler Senn, Principal/Activities Director, Bowman County**

Tyler Senn is a 1992 graduate of Granville High School. Tyler graduated from the University of Mary in 1997 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Mathematics Education and Physical Education. He earned his Masters in 7-12 Educational Leadership from North Dakota State University in 2014.

Tyler began his teaching and coaching career in 1998 at Des Lacs-Burlington as a math teacher while serving as an assistant baseball coach. In the fall of 1998, Tyler moved to Glenburn to teach 7-12 math and physical education. While in Glenburn he served as an elementary boys basketball coach, junior high girls basketball coach, assistant girls basketball coach, head girls basketball coach, and head baseball coach.

In 2005 Tyler moved to Bowman. While at Bowman County Tyler has taught junior high math and high school physical education. Tyler has served as assistant boys basketball coach, head boys basketball coach, junior high boys basketball coach, assistant track and field coach and assistant cross country coach during his time at Bowman County. Tyler has been the Activities Director at Bowman County since 2007 and was hired as the 7-12 Principal in 2015.

During his time as Activities Director he has managed district, regional, and invitational tournaments/invites for basketball, wrestling, cross country, volleyball, track and field, and golf. Travis began his teaching and coaching career in Starkweather-Munich as a social science instructor while serving as the head girls basketball coach. In 2005, Travis became the social science teacher and head boys basketball and golf coach at Langdon Area High School. Travis was in Langdon for 5 years before he took the role as high school principal and athletic director in Cooperstown at Griggs County Central School. In 2013, Travis took over as the superintendent at Griggs County Central. In 2015 he and his family relocated to Bismarck where Travis spent one year as the Superintendent at Shiloh Christian School. Currently he serves as the Superintendent at Beulah Public Schools in Beulah, ND. Travis has been a certified basketball official for the past two years. ### **North Dakota Association of Secondary School Principals Candidate Warren Strand, Principal, Fessenden-Bowdon Public School**

Warren Strand is a 1990 graduate of Mohall High School. Warren graduated from Minot State University in 1995 with a Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education. He earned his Master of Education in Elementary and Secondary Administration from the University of Mary in 2014.

Warren began his teaching and coaching career in Fessenden as a third-grade teacher, while serving as the head boys basketball and fifth and sixth-grade girls basketball coach.

Throughout his years in Fessenden, Warren has taught junior high Math, English, History, Literature, fifth and sixth-grade Math, Social Studies, and Science. He was the head coach for girls basketball and boys and girls track. He also was an assistant coach for football, boys basketball, boys and girls track, and junior high football. ## Questions and Answers – NDHSAA Aids to Interpretations

**Executive Director’s Note:** The NDHSAA will periodically share questions and answers pertaining to NDHSAA By-Laws, regulations, and Board of Directors interpretations. The intent of this section is to aid administrators in interpreting commonly received questions. If you have a question that you would like explained in future publications, contact NDHSAA Executive Director Matthew Fetsch.

**Question #1:** Our girls basketball season begins on November 14 and several of our players are participating in the NDHSAA State Volleyball Tournament on November 17-19. Do basketball practices in which a player misses due to volleyball practices and matches count towards their 9 required basketball practices?

**Answer:** Yes. Board Regulation #2 on Part III, p. 2 of the NDHSAA Constitution & By-Law’s states that “required preseason practices which are not attended by an athlete because that athlete is actively involved in practice for or participation in NDHSAA post season athletic competition held concurrently with such preseason practices shall be waived.” Note that the waiver does not apply to sports that are played during the same season (ex - cross country and volleyball).

**Question #2:** Our junior high boys basketball season does not begin until January. Can a student that plays at the junior high level only play on a non-school basketball team in December?

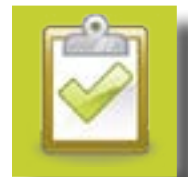
**Answer:** Yes, provided it is allowed per local school policy. Schools determine the start and end of their junior high basketball seasons. Any participation on a non-school team following the first official school practice would result in the loss of eligibility for six contests for each contest played on a non-school team (Part II, Art. XIV, Sec. IIIa).



## NDHSAA Information - Find Officials’ Information

Each month we post an NDHSAA Information article in our BULLETIN. This month the topic is finding officials’ information. In order to find contact information for officials in NDHSAA you must have administrative privileges. To view officials and their contact information:

- Log in to NDHSAA
- Click on the officials tab on the left side of the page
- Click the Filter button on the right side of the page and choose a sport from the drop down menu
- You will see a list of all officials registered to officiate the sport you have selected for the current school year
- You may sort by clicking on the arrows on any column
- To show more than 10 officials on a page click a higher number than 10 from the Show Entries drop down menu
- You may view this information online or export to Excel by clicking on the Export icon on the top right side of the page.

### *NDHSAA Website Login Information*

The NDHSAA website includes a public portion for public viewing and a password protected portion for school and NDHSAA administration of sports and activities. All coaches and advisors must create NDHSAA accounts in order to input their rosters, pictures, cutlines, schedules, tournament entrants and results.

To create an NDHSAA account, go to our website <http://www.ndhsaa.com> and locate the Sign In section on the top right side of the page. Click on the "Create an Account" link. You must enter your account information then request a role at your school. To request a role, select your role coach (sports), activity advisor/coach (fine arts), staff, etc. and click the blue "Request Role" button. Then select the school you are affiliated with from the drop down menu, choose your sport or activity from the drop down menu and Click the "Request Role" button. Repeat the role selection process until you have requested all of your roles in your school. After submission, the main user at your school will approve your role(s) and you will be able to enter information concerning your sport or activity.

## Changing Email Addresses in NDHSAA Account

As schools transition to new email addresses, users are reminded they must edit email addresses in the NDHSAA system. ### To edit your NDHSAA email address/login:

## Coaches and Officials Mandatory Online Testing

Officials and head coaches of winter sports basketball, gymnastics, hockey and wrestling must take an open book test in the sport(s) in which he/she is a head coach/official. The test will be available online only and must be completed and submitted within the applicable window. The test will be available by following the Online Testing link on the main page of the NDHSAA website. ([www.ndhsaa.com](http://www.ndhsaa.com))



The NDHSAA office will assess a penalty of \$25 for non-completion of any mandatory online exam by a head coach. Officials non completion of a mandatory online exam will result in a lower classification the following year. If an official is certified, they will drop to probationary for one year in that sport. If an official is probationary they will drop to ineligible for one year in that sport.

## Winter Season NDHSAA Website Requirements & Deadlines

Winter sport rosters/pictures/cutlines and schedules are soon due. (A cutline identifies the lineup on the team photo.) Schools are required to have this information for all winter sports uploaded to NDHSAA three weeks into each season. Failure to upload required information will result in a \$50 late fee. Schools have the ability to edit this information as rosters change throughout the season.

This process allows invitational, district, regional and state tournament managers the ability to download and prepare tournament programs. The NDHSAA system will accept photos up to 10 MB in size.

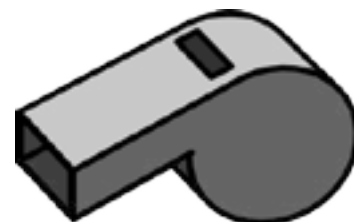

## NDHSAA Local (Sub-Varsity) Official Certification Available

NDHSAA has a process for certifying Local Sub-Varsity officials. Officials who complete all items needed to certify will be able to officiate at the sub-varsity level and below in the sport(s) in which they certify. This certification must be under the direction of an administrator of a NDHSAA member school.

### Requirements for Local Official include:

- 1) Completion of the NFHS Learn "Concussion in Sports - What you Need to Know" course. Users must create an account on the NFHSLearn site and purchase the course, although the course is free. Instructions are available on the NDHSAA website at the Concussion Management Information link on the main NDHSAA webpage.
- 2) Creation of NDHSAA Account. If prospective official has an existing NDHSAA account, requirements must be completed using the existing NDHSAA account and email address.
- 3) Completion of the online Local Officiating Rules Clinic, available on the "Clinic" tab when logged in to NDHSAA account.
- 4) Completion and submission of LOCAL Officials' Registration Form, available at end of Local Officiating Clinic.
- 5) Submission of payment to LOCAL school administrator for submission to NDHSAA for processing.



ALL 5 items must be complete BEFORE LOCAL officials are eligible to officiate contests. LOCAL Officials are able to officiate contests at the JV level and below only.

College or high school personnel with a B.S. in Music Education and 5 years experience (recommended) may judge NDHSAA sponsored Music Festivals if they successfully complete the online rules test.

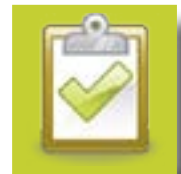

## NDHSAA Coaches Education - Permit Submission Form

Beginning in the fall of 2013 all coaches who work with student athletes in grades 9-12 must be certified. To become certified a coach must complete the requirements for a NDHSAA Coaching Permit. Member schools submit their coaching rosters through the NDHSAA Coaching Permit Submission Form. The NDHSAA Coaching Permit Submission form allows tracking of all coaches through member schools. This is the only form that will be accepted and it must be emailed electronically as an excel spreadsheet. If you would like to track more coach information than listed on this form, please feel free to add columns AFTER (to the right of column 10). Only columns 1-10 need be submitted to NDHSAA.



All coaches must be submitted each year. Only certified coaches not certified in a prior year will be mailed coaching permits. Coaching permits will be issued by the North Dakota High School Coaches Association. The due date for the Coaches Education Permit Submission form is April 1st each year.
